Enrique Morones received Mexico's highest award, Mexico's National Human Rights Award or OHTLI (the first time someone outside of Mexico wins the award) presented personally by Mexican President Felipe Calderón, in December 2009.

Internationally acclaimed Human Rights activist, Enrique was born in San Diego to Mexican parents who instilled in him a deep love for Mexico and a passion for social justice and a deep spiritual faith.

Former President of the San Diego County Hispanic Chamber of Commerce; Director then Vice President in Major League Sports with the San Diego Padres of Major League Baseball; President and Founder of House of Mexico in San Diego's Balboa Park (to promote Mexico's art, culture and history), Morones is the President and Founder of Border Angels. Border Angels is an all volunteer group established in 1986 which places water in the desert and blankets and food in the winter on border areas to help save migrant lives.

Enrique continues his all volunteer Human Rights work, resides in San Diego and lives by "when I was hungry did you give me to eat, when I was thirsty did you give me to drink" Matthew 25:35.
